

Graham, Bob. <u>How to Heal a Broken Wing.</u> (E GRA) **2009 Charlotte Zolotow Medal Winner** llustrations and easy-to-read text explore the light that makes a house in the night a home filled with light.

Foley, Greg. <u>Thank You Bear.</u> (available through MORE) **2008 Charlotte Zolotow Medal Winner** Despite the criticism of others, a bear finds the perfect gift for his mouse friend.

McCarty, Peter. Moon Plane. (available through MORE) **2007 Charlotte Zolotow Medal Winner**A young boy looks at a plane in the sky and imagines flying one all the way to the moon.

Rodman, Mary Ann. My Best Friend. (available through MORE) 2006 Charlotte Zolotow Medal Winner
Six-year-old Lily has a best friend all picked out for play group day, but unfortunately the differences between first-graders and second-graders are sometimes very large.
